## DIRECTOR'S NOTE

I am old enough to remember walking into the Blockbuster Video (RIP) in my hometown of Johnson City, Tennessee, and renting a VHS copy of the 1989 film Heathers. I remember thinking about how clever the script was, how beautiful Winona Ryder was and how cool Christian Slater was. But I also remember how the film spoke to the alienation and disgust I felt at my own experience in high school. How it highlighted the unspoken rules that everyone had to follow and the real consequences for those who broke them. The film showed the ways that some people seemed untouchable and some of us seemed battered and broken.

All these years later it's my great privilege to direct this production of the musical adaptation. I quickly realized that this script contains all of the same sharp observations about how students often feel like they are navigating dangerous waters with little to guide them and how much the adults in their lives can seem powerless to help or even notice them. That those points are made along with some incredibly catchy songs and deeply thought provoking lyrics is one of the reasons this show immediately entered the pantheon of modern musical theatre.

I am so grateful for my artistic collaborators in this process; especially the extraordinary talent that is Seth Butler, our musical director; Meghan McEleney who, along with her assistants Charleston and Maddie, created much of the lovely choreography, and my amazing stage management team of Lindy, Rylee and Eric.

I am especially honored to work with the students in this production who devoted so much of their time, attention, and breathtaking talent to this work. The people they portray might be confused and violent but these students are artists who are trying to make something special happen in this place.
